Disaster Relief Aid - Hurricane Matthew

Hurricane Harvey made landfall near Corpus Christi, Texas, on Friday, August 25 as a Category 4 hurricane with 130 mile per hour winds. The storm is causing widespread flooding and significant damage across southern Texas and Louisiana as the slow moving storm drops several feet of water throughout the region. UCC Disaster Ministries continues to monitor the situation and maintain contact with the South Central Conference and partners as well as federal and state agencies.

By the Numbers:

- * Category 4 hurricane at landfall (first since 2004)
- ***** 130mph winds
- * Nearly 300,000 without power
- * 49 inches of rain in some regions and it's still raining
- ** Red Cross preparing to shelter 20,000-30,000
- * 500,000 homes already affected
