## Option #1

# **Order for Imposition of Ashes**

#### CALL TO CONFESSION

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. Repentance, fasting, prayer, study, and works of love help us return to that love. We therefore, recommit ourselves to love God and neighbor by confessing our sins and by asking God for strength and perseverance in our spiritual disciplines during Lent.

#### **CONFESSION OF SIN** (adapted from the E&R Hymnal)

Almighty God, most merciful Heavenly Father: I a poor sinner, acknowledge and confess my many sins, which I from time to time have committed, by my thoughts, words, and actions and inactions, against your Divine Majesty and against my neighbors, to whom you have called upon me to love. I do earnestly repent, and am heartily sorry for these my sins; the remembrance of them grieves me. I have no other comfort or hope than your grace, O God, and the previous merits of Jesus Christ, which abounds above my guilt and shame. Longing after this grace, I confess: Lord, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight, and I am no longer worthy to be called your child. Grant me your pardon and peace, and strengthen me to lead a new and righteous life, by the power of your Holy Spirit, through my Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

#### IMPOSITION OF ASHES

{Please note that palm ashes are extremely acidic and may result in a rash for those with sensitive skin.

We do not recommend infants receiving ashes.

You may wish to mix the ash with olive oil, or you may use it plain}

## WORDS OF ABASEMENT

{Words of abasement, are words that reprimand, berate, chide, or scold us for our sins, and remind us (from the book of Genesis) that we were created from dust, and our mortal bodies will one day return to dust. You may say these words to yourself, perhaps in front of a mirror, or better yet, if someone else in your household is willing to do so, have someone else say these words to you}.

While making the sign of the cross on the forehead or back of the hand, say the following:

Remember you are dust, and to dust, you shall return.

## PRAYER FOR MERCY "Kyrie"

Lord, have mercy Christ, have mercy Lord, have mercy

#### LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven,
Hallowed be thy name.
Thy kingdom come,
thy will be done on earth
as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread,
and forgive us our debts
as we forgive our debtors,
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom and the power,
and the glory forever. Amen.

## **ASSURANCE OF PARDON** (adapted from the E&R Hymnal)

Hear now the comforting assurance of the grace of God, promised in the Gospel to all who repent and believe: As I live says the Lord God, I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from their way and live. God so loved the world that he gave us his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. Wherefore, beloved, those who have truly turned to God with full-hearted repentance and sincere faith, may assuredly believe that our sins are forgiven; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

## **BENEDICTION** (adapted from the E&R Hymnal)

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit, be with us all. Shalom; go in peace. Amen.
