OLD TESTAMENT LESSON from 1 Kings 19:4-8

--- (NRSV)

Lector: Our Old Testament lesson for this morning is taken from 1 Kings 19:4-8....

Lector: ⁴ But [Elijah] himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: "It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors."

⁵ Then [Elijah] lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, "Get up and eat."

⁶ [Elijah] looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again.

⁷ The angel of the LORD came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you."

⁸ [Elijah] got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.

Lector: Thus ends the Old Testament lesson.

Lector: Let us praise God with the Psalm....

Lector: I will bless the LORD at all times;

People: his praise shall continually be in my mouth.

Lector: My soul makes its boast in the LORD;

People: let the humble hear and be glad.

Lector: O magnify the LORD with me,

People: and let us exalt his name together.

Lector: I sought the LORD,

People: and he answered me, and delivered me from all my fears.

Lector: Look to him, and be radiant;

People: so your faces shall never be ashamed.

Lector: This poor soul cried,

People: and was heard by the LORD, and was saved from every trouble.

Lector: The angel of the LORD encamps around those who fear him,

People: and delivers them.

Lector: O taste and see that the LORD is good;

ALL: happy are those who take refuge in him.

Lector: Let us join in a responsive reading from the Apostle Paul’s letter to the Ephesians....

Lector: So then, putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbors,

People: for we are members of one another.

Lector: Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger,

People: and do not make room for the devil.

Lector: Thieves must give up stealing;

People: rather let them labor and work honestly with their own hands, so as to have something to share with the needy.

Lector: Let no evil talk come out of your mouths,

People: but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that our words may give grace to those who hear.

Lector: And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God,

People: with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption.

Lector: Put away from you

People: all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice,

Lector: and be kind to one another,

People: tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven us.

Lector: Therefore be imitators of God,

People: as beloved children,

Lector: and live in love,

People: as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

GOSPEL LESSON: John 6:35, 41-51 (Leader)

³⁵ Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

⁴¹ Then the Judeans began to complain about [Jesus] because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." ⁴² They were saying, "Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" ⁴³ Jesus answered them, "Do not complain among yourselves. ⁴⁴ No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me; and I will raise that person up on the last day. ⁴⁵ It is written in the prophets, 'And they shall all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me. ⁴⁶ Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. ⁴⁷ Very truly, I tell you, whoever believes has eternal life. ⁴⁸ I am the bread of life. ⁴⁹ Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. ⁵⁰ This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. ⁵¹ I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."
