#### **INTRODUCTORY SENTENCES:** (Leader)

We gather around the Advent wreath today knowing that we are not perfect-that we all make mistakes and do bad things. Only Jesus obeyed God fully. Jesus helps us to live as God wants us to live. Jesus gives us peace.

#### **READING OF SCRIPTURE:** (Leader)

"For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this." (from Isaiah 9:6-7)

#### LIGHTING OF THE CANDLE: (Leader)

We light this candle to proclaim the coming of the light of God into the world. With the coming of this light there is peace, for Christ is called the "Prince of Peace." Christ's name is also Emmanuel, "God with us." The second presence of Christ with us gives us peace day by day.

# We Hear the Word of God

We seek to learn more about God's love and grace, and how we are to live our lives as disciples of Jesus Christ. The Bible is our primary text on faith, which we consider to be scripture - sacred writings. We believe the Bible to be the "inspired word of God." Gospel (which means "Good News") refers to Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, which are Christians' most central books of the Bible.

#### PROCLAMATION OF SCRIPTURE Old Testament Lesson: New Testament Canticle:

Malachi 3:1-4 Luke 1:67-80

{A canticle is scripture that is not in the Book of Psalms, originally written in the Bible as a song, often read responsively with sung responses during worship.}

- Leader: Let us praise God with the Canticle of Zechariah... Then John the Baptist's father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke this prophecy:

### The Flow of the Worship Service

Our worship service has an intentional order to it. The flow of worship is called the liturgical movement. The movement reminds us weekly of our journey in faith of moving from being separated from God by sin, to being restored by God's grace as disciples of Christ. # About Today

**Church Season: Advent** - is a season of preparation for the coming of Christ: (1) the second coming of Christ; (2) the preparation for the anniversary of Jesus' birth on Christmas; and (3) the reminder to be daily aware of Christ's presence for the Kingdom of God is near. The season of Advent takes place during the four weeks before Christmas.

**Color of the Paraments** (cloths on the altar, pulpit, and lecturn):

**Blue** - symbolizes the hope found in the anticipated coming of Christ

**Violet** - symbolizes royalty and penitent preparation for Christ our King, who offers forgiveness **Rose/Pink** - symbolizes joy, as expressed by Jesus' mother Mary

The suggested scripture lessons are from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), which selects passages throughout the Bible over a three year cycle. The RCL is the most common lectionary used by Christian churches. We are in **Year C**, which emphasizes the Gospel of Luke.

The Bible is in two sections: Old Testament - OT (scripture prior to Christ's birth), located in the first 2/3 of the Bible; and New Testament - NT (about Christ & early church). The first four books of the NT are called the "Gospels," which Christians consider the most central books of the Bible.

### This Sunday, December 5 -- Lectionary Reading for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent

Malachi 3:1-4 or Baruch 5:1-9; Luke 1:68-79; Philippians 1:3-11; Luke 3:1-6

#### Malachi

Malachi is the last book of the OT. It was written between 465-444 B.C. This book carries two messages: (1) because of their lack of devotion to God, God is not pleased with the people of the church; and (2) God will soon send a messenger to purify and reunite Israel.

#### Baruch

Baruch was a scribe and friend of the OT prophet Jeremiah. His book contains the oldest writings about the exile of the Jewish people in 597 B.C. by the Babylonian King Nebuchadnezzar, during the reign of the Jewish King Jehoiakim (609-598 B.C.). It was written to lead the Jewish people and their king to confess their sin, pray for God's forgiveness, and seek God's wisdom; and to console them that God was with them and would deliver and restore them. None of the original Hebrew writings of this book have ever been found. The present form was compiled and adapted in 168 B.C. to bring comfort to the Jewish people after the Syrian army captured and descrated their Temple in 167 B.C.

Baruch is a deuteroncanonical (after-canon or second-canon) text in the Roman Catholic and Orthodox churches, and an apocryphal (secret, hidden, or non-canonical) book in most Protestant churches. The 18 deuteroncanonical/aprocryphal books are deemed important writings, but not held in the same high authoritative regard as the more widely accepted 66 canonized books of the Bible.

#### The Letter of Paul to the Philippians

This epistle (letter) (NT) was written by the Apostle Paul from prison in the 60s A.D. Paul and Timothy are sending this letter to the church in Philippi, thanking and rejoicing with them for their steadfast faithfulness, prayers, and support, cautioning them of missionaries who focus on physical wants and needs, and encouraging them to stay true and united to his and Timothy's teachings and example. Paul was a Christian, Jew, Pharisee, Roman citizen, and church leader, who had a direct encounter with Jesus Christ on the road to Damascus after Jesus' ascension into heaven. Paul wrote more of the NT than any other person.


### The Gospel According to Luke

The Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles is attributed to Luke "the beloved physician," written around 59-90 A.D. Not having met Jesus personally, Luke undertook the task of "investigating everything carefully from the very first, to write an orderly account" of Jesus Christ, "so that you may know the truth concerning the things about which you have been instructed."


