

### **About Today**

Church Season: Epiphany - Season of the manifestation of God incarnate to the world.

In Greek "phan" is "shine" or "manifest," and "epi" is "upon." The season of Epiphany continues from January 6 until Ash Wednesday.

Color of the Paraments (cloths on the altar and pulpit):

White - symbolizing the purity of Christ as we are washed in the baptismal waters and the blood of Christ.

The suggested scripture lessons are from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), which selects passages throughout the Bible over a three year cycle. The RCL is the most common lectionary used by Christian churches. We are in **Year C**, which emphasizes the Gospel of Luke.

The Bible is in two sections: Old Testament - OT (scripture prior to Christ's birth), located in the first 2/3 of the Bible; and New Testament - NT (about Christ & early church). The first four books of the NT are called the "Gospels," which Christians consider the most central books of the Bible.

### This Sunday, January 16 -- Lectionary Reading for the Second Sunday After Epiphany

### Isaiah

The book of Isaiah (OT) is attributed to three prophets. The first of whom is from where the book gets its name, and is about Isaiah's call to become a prophet and his prophecy that Jerusalem will face God's judgement regarding its immorality in order to be God's Holy City (chaps. 1-39, written 738-688 B.C.), the second is about living in exile in Babylon (chaps. 40-55, written 597-539 B.C.), and the third is about the return from exile to Judah and the rebuilding of the Temple (chaps. 56-66, written 520-515 B.C.). A prophet is one who is divinely appointed by God to lead and instruct.

### Psalm 36

Verses 5-10 praise God for his love to us and compare God's love to creation.

### The First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians

This NT Epistle (letter) was written by the Apostle Paul between 53-54 A.D. to a gentile congregation he had founded several years earlier in Corinth (the capital city of the Roman province of Achaia, a large and prospering urban center that was ethnically, culturally, and religiously diverse). This letter is in response to issues within the Corinthian church, in particular fractions caused by one-upmanship and privatization of faith. Paul encourages humility, unity within diversity, and witnessing to God's grace. Paul was a Christian, Jew, Pharisee, Roman citizen, and church leader, who had a direct encounter with Jesus Christ on the road to Damascus after Jesus' ascension into heaven. Paul wrote more of the NT than any other person.

### The Gospel According to John

John is the latest of the four Gospels, written around 80-90 A.D. probably in Ephesus, and attributed to John the son of Zebedee, the beloved disciple of Jesus. This Gospel was "written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and through believing you may have life in his name" (20:31).

## From the Addiction & Recovery Taskforce: Resolutions and Relapses

Many of us have made New Years resolutions that we have not kept. The idea is good but the follow-through is not there. In a few weeks we are back to the old habits again. We may be disappointed but go on. There is always next year.

For those suffering from the disease of drug addiction, it is not as easy as making a resolution to keep away from the addictive substance. Drug addiction is a chronic disease and like other chronic diseases like asthma or hypertension must be managed for life. The National Institute on Drug Abuse tells us that "Treatment enables people to counteract addiction's disruptive effects on their brain and behavior and regain control of their lives."

But because addiction is a chronic disease, some people will have relapses that will need to be treated. The relapse rate for substance abuse disorder is 40%-60% as compared with 50% to 70% for hypertension and asthma. Relapse can be very dangerous in drug addiction. Relapse does not mean failure; it means more treatment is needed.

# Message from Conference Minister—Covid 19

For almost two years we've been adapting to pandemic challenges. To say the toll on our emotional, spiritual, and congregational health has been high is an understatement. And yet we are not free from the need to be vigilant. The last two weeks have been a time of extraordinary uptick in the prevalence of COVID-19. 
