About Today

Church Season: Pentecost -which is the season of the church in mission. It is the time between the ascension of Christ and his second coming, which is the time we are presently living in today, and as such is the longest season of the church year. During this season we focus on how we, as disciples of Jesus Christ, are called by God to go out into the world and share his Good News through both our deeds and words.

Color of the Paraments (cloths on the altar and pulpit):

Green -symbolizing the growth of the Christian church, as we go out into the world and share God's Good News with both our words and actions, and invite others into the church of Jesus Christ.

The suggested scripture lessons are from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), which selects passages throughout the Bible over a three year cycle. The RCL is the most common lectionary used by

Christian churches. We are in Year C, which emphasizes the Gospel of Luke.

The Bible is in two sections: Old Testament - OT (scripture prior to Christ's birth), located in the first 2/3 of the Bible; and New Testament - NT (about Christ & early church). The first four books of the NT are called the "Gospels," which Christians consider the most central books of the Bible; the rest of the NT takes place after his ascension into heaven.

Isaiah 65:1-9

Psalm 22:19-28

Isaiah

The book of Isaiah (OT) is attributed to three prophets. The first of whom is from where the book gets its name, and is about Isaiah's call to become a prophet and his prophecy that Jerusalem will face God's judgement regarding its immorality in order to e God's Holy City (chaps. 1-9, written 738-688 B.C.), the second is about living in exile in Babylon (chaps. 40-55, written 597-539 B.C.), and the third is about the return from exile to Judah and the rebuilding of the Temple (chaps. 56-66, written 520-515 B.C.). A prophet is one who is divinely appointed by God to lead and instruct.

Psalm 22:19-28

This OT song is attributed to King David. This song is a prayer to God, asking for help in times of distress, giving thanks and praise to God for his presence and deliverance in times of affliction, and reaffirming the vow to worship and follow in the ways of the Lord.

The Letter of Paul to the Galatians

This NT Epistle (letter) was written to the churches of Galatia by the apostle Paul sometime between 49-55 A.D. Within this letter is the critical theological doctrine of justification by faith (salvation by God's actions through Jesus Christ, not by our own actions). Paul was a Christian, Jew, Pharisee, Roman citizen, and church leader, who had a direct encounter with Jesus Christ on the road to Damascus after Jesus' ascension into heaven. Paul wrote more of the NT than any other person.

The Gospel According to Luke

The Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles is attributed to Luke "the beloved physician," written around 59-90 A.D. (C.E.). Not having met Jesus personally, Luke undertook the task of "investigating everything carefully from the very first, to write an orderly account" of Jesus Christ, "so that you may know the truth concerning the things about which you have been instructed."

From the Addiction & Recovery Taskforce: Step Two

Step Two - We came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.


Many addicts have a hard time with the idea of a Higher Power until the full measure of our powerlessness is accepted. We become willing to consider seeking help from a Power greater than our disease. Our understanding of a Higher Power is up to us. We can call it the group, the program, or we can call it God. The only suggestion is that it be loving, caring, and greater than ourselves.

Addicts experience unconditional love by receiving help from other addicts. For most, this may be their first experience. The group's collective experience is itself a Power greater than our own. We begin learning what works and what doesn't through others shared experiences. Attending meetings day after day is an example of the presence of a Higher Power; an attractive, caring force that helps addicts stay clean. By keeping an open mind, we identify other sources of that Power and find a way to incorporate it into our daily lives.

Our understanding and relationship deepens with our Higher Power as we go further into our personal recovery. We continue the journey by moving on to Step Three.
