

Service of Honored Remembrance

Sacrament of Holy Communion ^{0.®}

The Sacrament of Holy Communion is the central act of Christian worship, bringing us more fully together with one another and the Triune God, through the sacrifice of the body and blood of Jesus Christ. (Matthew 26:20-30, Mark 14:17-26, Luke 22:14-23, John 13:21-30)

*INVITATION

- Leader: Dearly beloved in the Lord: Our blessed Saviour Jesus Christ instituted the Holy Communion of his Body and Blood, that it might be the abiding memorial of his atoning death; the seal of his perpetual presence in the Church through the Holy Spirit; the mystical representation of the sacrifice of himself on the cross; the pledge of his undying love for his people; and the bond of his living union and fellowship with them to the end of time.

Leader:

CALL TO THE SUPPER

Leader: The gifts of God for the people of God. Come, for all things are ready.

SHARING THE ELEMENTS

{This morning we will be partaking of communion in small groups in front of the Chancel Rail.

The choir will come forward as the first group. The ushers will then guide persons a few pews at a time down the center aisle. You may stand or kneel at the rail.

The Pastors will distribute the bread, then instruct to consume at the same time. For those preferring **gluten free bread**, please pick up a piece as you approach the Chancel Rail.

> The Elders will distribute the **red wine** and **white grape juice** and the Pastor will then instruct people to consume at the same time.

The Pastor will dismiss persons to return to their pews using the side aisles, and you can place your empty cup in the tray as you depart.

The Pastor and Elders will bring communion to the pews for those who cannot come forward.}

{We invite all baptized Christians who profess a belief in Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour to participate in the sacrament of Holy Communion. You do not need to be a member of this congregation or of the UCC to participate in Communion.

Children who have not yet completed the confirmation class program, are to take the communion classes prior to communing. Children of visitors who are not yet confirmed are welcome to commune here, if they commune at their home church.

> Children who are not yet communing may come forward to receive a blessing. To indicate that you prefer a blessing, simply keep your hands by your side.}

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The Flow of the Worship Service

Our worship service has an intentional order to it. The flow of worship is called the liturgical movement. The movement reminds us weekly of our journey in faith of moving from being separated from God by sin, to being restored by God's grace as disciples of Christ. It is based on the sixth chapter of the Biblical book of Isaiah.

(1) God welcomes us and invites us

(2) We respond to God's call by worshiping Him

- (3) We confess our need for God's forgiveness and grace
- (4) We are assured of God's forgiveness and grace
- (5) We learn more about God's will through scripture, song, and sermon
- (6) We grow closer to God and one another through prayer
- (7) We give God thanks by offering our time, talent, and treasure
- (8) We experience greater oneness with God and each another through Holy Communion
- (9) God sends us into the world to share His love and grace with others

About Today

Church Season: Pentecost - which is the season of the church in mission. It is the time between the ascension of Christ and his second coming, which is the time we are presently living in today, and as such is the longest season of the church year. The day of Pentecost is the birthday of the Christian church.

Color of the Paraments (cloths on the altar and pulpit):

- White symbolizing the defeat of death and the darkness of sin with the resurrection to eternal life.
- **Green** (commonly used on the "Sundays After Pentecost") symbolizing the growth of the church through evangelism and mission of sharing the Good News in word and in deed.

Sunday, November 5, 2023 - Lectionary Reading All Saints Day

Revelation 7:9-17; Psalm 34:1-10, 22; 1 John 3:1-3; Matthew 5:1-12; 7:24-29 Readings for the 23rd Sunday After Pentecost (Proper 26): Micah 3:5-12 & Psalm 43; Joshua 3:7-17 & Psalm 107:1-7, 33-37; 1 Thessalonians 2:9-13; Matthew 23:1-12

The Revelation to John (Apocalypse)

This is the last book in the NT, which is a prophetic book written by a person named "John" who was probably born into the Jewish faith in Palestine and moved to Asia Minor between 66-73A.D. This is probably not the same John who wrote the Gospel of John or the Letters of John. This book is believed to be written between 64 - 96 A.D. Some scholars believe that this book developed over a period of time, with 1:4-11 and 4:1-22:5 being written around 64 A.D., and the rest of the book being written sometime between 81-96 A.D. The genre of this book is "apocalypse" (revelation). Biblically, an apocalypse is usually a first-person narrative (generally written under a pen name of a noted Biblical character) where the author retells a vision about the future, heaven, or both.

Psalm 34

In 1 Samuel 21:10-15, King David feigned madness before King Achish. This is an OT song of thanksgiving to God written by King David for escaping Achish. It instructs the community to know the goodness of God.

The First Letter of John

This epistle (letter) is a homily (sermon) to be read to Christian congregations, attributed to the apostle John, as is the Gospel of John. Of the core 12, John is believed to be the "beloved disciple" (John 19:26). This epistle is believed to be written in Ephesus around 100 A.D. Throughout much of this letter, John is writing to promote unity in following the way of Christ, in opposition to those who are creating division by wrongfully leading the church away from God's path, intent, and calling for the Christian church.

The Gospel According to Matthew


Matthew's Gospel was written around 80-90 A.D. in Antioch, Syria by a Greek-speaking Jewish Christian. The first writing was probably by a Christian scribe who wrote in the name of Matthew. Matthew was a disciple who knew Jesus personally.
